For most of us Christmas 2024 will be our 80th. God has graciously granted us longevity. However, we have been given much more. We have a faithful savior!



I married Peggy in July 1966, so this is our fifty-eighth Christmas. We are thankful to God for each one. I will share a little of my post Wabash life through a few Christmas stories.

Vietnam loomed over our first three Christmases. We were with Peggy's family in Fairmount, IN for our first Christmas. I was on leave from the Army. We were near my family for Christmases 1967 and 68 at Fort Huachuca, AZ. For Christmas 1968 we were excited to celebrate with our newborn son, Bart.

I went to Vietnam in November 1969. Peggy and Bart lived with Peggy's parents. The grandparents were thankful for the opportunity to enjoy Christmas with their daughter and grandson. I was in Cu Chi, Vietnam with the 25th Infantry Division. I arrived in November and was immediately responsible for planning and coordinating the movement of 20,000 soldiers by air and ground transportation into and out of Cu Chi base camp for the Bob Hope Show. Bob Hope's long-time tradition of visiting the troops overseas at Christmas was a big boost for morale. However, even Bob Hope and a Christmas dinner could not make up for being away from family. I was still very thankful to celebrate Christmas.

Following Christmas I successfully commanded Company B, 25th Supply & Transport Battalion, the truck company of the division. Company B was awarded the Meritorious Unit Citation in recognition of the soldiers' extraordinary work maintaining a fleet of over 100 trucks and trailers to deliver supplies to combat units under the constant threat of enemy activity. This success was not without cost. We had one soldier killed by the enemy. It was extremely difficult
